5. Finance:

1.2.24 - NALC Update on Banking Issues: Possible causes of issues for clerks/RFO's to discharge statutory financial duties under The Local Govt Act 1972 are the inability of Banks to understand what local councils are, how they work and what sector they fit in to. Issues are changes of signatory, mandate changes, repeatedly being threatened with account closure and for clerks to produce financial evidence that their councillors were not or had been bankrupt. This may be as a result of transition to on line banking, post Brexit money laundering regulations, bank closures and mis-categorisation of local councils as clubs or charities and the off shoring of call centres to Asia or the USA. NALC has consulted with UK Finance to highlight issues and Guidance Notes for banks on how to categorise and understand how local councils function, has now been produced. Barclays has now changed categorisation of local councils and supplied direct contact data assistance.

24.1.24 – SC Updated Planning Enforcement Protocol: Due to possible breaching of data protection legislation, future Planning Enforcement Investigations including producing of confidential details/documents or publishing the property address in a public meeting should not be disclosed as an Agenda Item. If a breach of planning legislation has occurred this should be an end of agenda item in a closed session discussion once the public has left and live streaming ceased. Details can be published only when a formal notice is served. There is now a dedicated Enforcement team supported by wider planning & technical specialists to investigate potential planning breaches. This has resulted in swifter determinations. Compliance with planning legislation is on the property owners resulting in submitting a retrospective application or to alter or change the development to meet

planning consent or a permitted development right. Concerns have been raised that councils are notified of cases opening but no closure of case alert. If there are cases of particular interest to a council, then on receipt of details the Enforcement team can be contacted. A council can be added to the case as an interested party and notified of any progress or action to be taken.

CPRE- Following campaigning, from summer 2024 Planning Permission will be required for future short term lets with a national register to ensure all accommodation is safe. A Govt Consultation includes a CPRE proposal that any future new build homes will have mandatory rooftop solar panels.

Objection Comments submitted 9.6.23. **Decision Date: 1.2.24 The Planning Inspectorate appointed by the Secretary of State, has upheld the Enforcement Notice and Dismissed the Appeal.** The owner has to vacate the use of the land as a caravan site for residential purposes within 3 mths. He has 6 mths to remove x2 static caravans and the touring caravan along with the associated paraphernalia brought on to the land in connection with using the land as a caravan site for residential purposes. However the Notice does not include the x3 lorry backs storage units which are exempt on the grounds that their intended use could continue for agricultural purposes and therefore can remain on site.

- Martyn's Law - Proposed Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Bill requirements for those responsible for smaller capacity premises (100 – 799 persons) There have been changes to remove the need for specific terrorist training and the need to complete a Terrorism Evaluation prior to each event, that now reasonable and practical procedures can be followed.
